Transportation



Establishment and Development of UMY



19**81**

UMY was established as one of Muhammadiyah's business affiliations, a religious social organization, on 1 March 1981. During this period, SPG Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta became the first building where UMY students pursued their study.



19**85**

In 1985-1992, the first 4-stories UMY campus building built in the ASRI Field of Jl. Hos Cokroaminoto 17 Yogyakarta. This campus also served as an unofficial means of publication, as it represented UMY in Yogyakarta's presence and existence.



19**97**

A central UMY campus was launched in 1988 to be founded in Ngebel, Tamantirto, Kasihan, Bantul, Yogyakarta on 25 hectares. The establishment began in July 1995, and the construction of the primary buildings of UMY was completed in 1997, so-called twin towers.



To**day**

The central campus continues to be developed and involved with the development of assets and support facilities such as the Research Centre and Student Dormitory; the process continues into 2019. UMY also plans to build a Central Research and Innovation Center (M. Dasron Hamid) to begin in 2019.

Accomodation

UMY provides its students with a dormitory called UNIRES (University Residence), which is accessible for graduate students, exchange students and visitors to the university. This location is a quick walk from campus. It provides a good atmosphere for personal development, extension of Islamic understanding, and development of English and Arabic abilities for students. UNIRES also has other activities for students, such as crafts and physical exercises, to spend their recreational time. - 3 Send the required documents to Cooperation and International Affairs Office UMY through e-mail bkln@umy.ac.id
- 4 Wait for the result.

Application Process for Exchange Student Program

- 1 Apply for the exchange student program from Home University
- 2 Nominated by the International Office of Home University
- 3 Document sent to UMY
- 4 UMY examines the application
- 5 Result informed by UMY
- 6 Applicants receive "Letter of Acceptance" or "Letter of Rejection".



Immigration

The international students who are going to study at Universitas Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta need to learn two key immigration steps to be completed before studying at UMY. These two steps are the VISA application process and the residence permit process.

The Overall Immigration Flow for International Students



The explanation for each number:

- 1. Your university will send to the CIA UMY the name lists of students who get the scholarship
- 2. The CIA UMY will send the Letter of Acceptance (LoA) attached by the immigration guideline to the student and some requirements to apply for the Visa
- 3. The student sends the required documents to CIA UMY
- 4. The CIA UMY will process the documents to the Indonesian Ministry of Research, Technology and Higher Education until the Telex Visa applying process is done
- 5. When the Telex Visa is already served by the Indonesian Ministry of Research, Technology, and Higher Education of Indonesia then the Telex Visa will be sent to the addressed Indonesian Embassy
- 6. The student comes to the Indonesian Embassy to take the Visa (mostly it takes 3-7 days to pick the Visa from the embassy)
- 7. Then, the student can come to Indonesia, and the student has to go to CIA UMY to process their Limited Stay Permit (ITAS) before 30 days staying in Indonesia.
- 8. The CIA UMY will accompany the student to submit their documents to the immigration office.
- 9. Finally, after getting the ITAS, the student should report him/herself to the Police Office as the requirement for extending the Limited Stay Permit.
