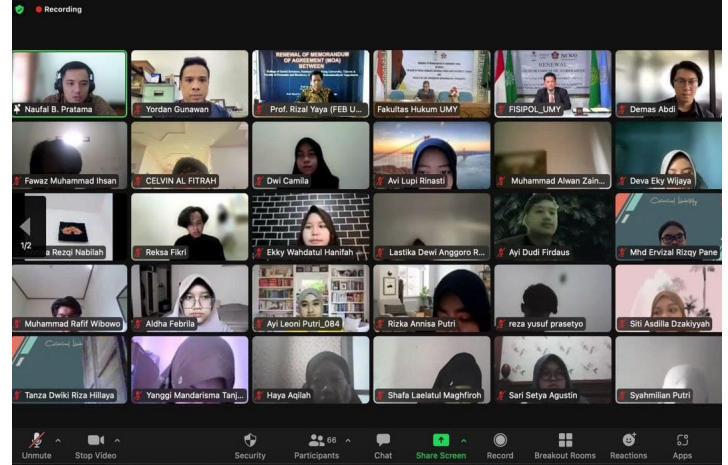

UMY Renew its Collaborations with National Cheng Kung University!

Continuing its “Young and Global” credo, Universitas Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta’s Faculty of Social and Political Sciences, Law, Economics, and Business has re-established collaboration with

Taiwan’s National Cheng Kung University’s College of Social Science. Through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding, which took place virtually on (13/04).

For your information, Universitas Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta has collaborated with NCKU since 2017, this collaboration includes student and educational staff study programs as well as research collaborations.

Yordan Gunawan, Head of International Relations Office UMY, opened the event with remarks. Yordan, an NCKU alumnus, welcomes the re-establishment of UMY-NCKU collaboration.
