Chairman of Indonesian Judicial Commission officially Appointed as Professor of Faculty of Law UMY!

The sharing economy system, which was created as a result of the 4.0 revolution, is growing swiftly alongside the free market system. This causes new problems with judicial regulation and public welfare. During the Professor's Scientific Remarks in the Sportorium UMY,

Prof. Dr. Mukti Fajar of the University of Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta (UMY) explained the presentation. The seminar on "Law and Welfare: Regulatory Concepts in the Sharing Economy Era" was held on Wednesday, 25th of May.

According to Prof. Dr. Mukti Fajar, the disruptive sharing economy system faces several legal challenges, including unfair competition for business actors through dishonest and illegal means.



The Chairman of the Indonesian Judicial Commission stated that the regulations governing the sharing economy in the transportation sector, for instance, are an incremental and trial-and-error-based policy.

"For example, in the case of on-line transportation, the Indonesian government has offered 5 regulations of minister for transportation, but the five of them are considered not able to properly regulate, and even lose when in a judicial review because it prevents the entry of business actors in the market," he continued.
