UMY with the Administrative Court of Yogyakarta Held a Signing Ceremony and Public Lecture!



On Tuesday, October 11, in the AR Fachrudin B Building, the Administrative Court of Yogyakarta and Universitas Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta (UMY)

signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) that was followed by a public lecture.

Direct signatures from the UMY Rector and the Chief of the Yogyakarta Administrative Court launched the collaboration
