Universitas Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta (UMY) with Lilly Family School of Philanthropy Indiana University and Intuitive Institute hosted the first fundraising management workshop in Indonesia named Certified Fund Raising Management (CFRM).

From 5th to 16th December, all the participants will be trained by Shariq Siddiqui, JD, Ph.D., an assistant professor of Philanthropic Studies and

Director of the Muslim Philanthropy Initiative. To seek and strengthen the non-profit, and charitable sectors in the developing world, the training is designed for the participants to acquire fundamental

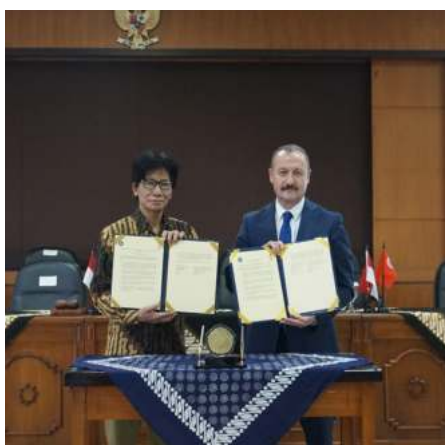


UMY with Kirikkale Üniversitesi and Prof. Dr. Fuat Sezgin Foundation held Public Lecture and MoU Signing
