Munadi Herlambang, Director of Institutional Relations at PT Jasa Raharja, hopes that this collaboration will raise awareness among universities about the importance of traffic safety awareness.

"It is hoped that by signing this MOU, Jasa Raharja and Universities will be able to raise awareness, particularly among young people, about driving better and safer, thereby reducing the number and fatality due to accidents,"
